This is a part-time (35 hours week for 8-12 weeks) position ultimately reporting to the Executive Director with daily direction from the Program Coordinator.

Training will be provided on-the-job.

Position: Lidz on Kidz Program - Community Organization Worker

Primary Function: To support the implementation of our annual Lidz on Kidz program within the Waterloo-Wellington community.

Age of applicants: This position is open to individuals between the ages of 15 – 30 as part of the Canada Summer Jobs initiative

Salary/Hours: This position is for 35 hours per week for 8 weeks at a rate of \$18.50 per hour.

Major Duties:

Reporting to the Executive Director, taking direction from the Program Coordinator, the successful applicant will become part of the staff and volunteer resource team supporting the Lidz On Kidz helmet giveaway and education program.

Administrative

- Assist in marketing of the program – social media, print materials (posters, information sheets), email
- Organize intake and registration for helmet recipients
- Create and organize reminder emails
- Maintain helmet inventory



- Direct volunteers at events

In the Community

- Represent BIAWW within the community and at community events
- Attend BIAWW events and helmet giveaways
- Support set up, organization and implementation of helmet giveaways
- Assist with the launch and presentation of education programs in local schools.

The staff will also be responsible for supporting other team members with our community programs during this time.

The staff will also attend our virtual programming (support group meetings, chats, activities) to observe first-hand the effects of brain injuries on survivors and caregivers. This will give them a better understanding of the long-term impact of this injury.

Qualifications:

- Strong written/verbal communication skills and organizational skills
- Strong technology skills (website tools, excel, email, social media - Instagram/Twitter/FB)
- Ability to work independently and with flexible hours

Requirements

- The staff will be required to use their own computer and cell phone.
- Access to a vehicle or transportation to all areas of Waterloo-Wellington is required
- Availability to work days/evenings/weekends as event needs require.
